




#### MESSAGE FROM THE

# Sustainability & Corporate Responsibility

We are thrilled to share the exciting initiatives our team has been working on to promote sustainability and corporate responsibility. Our dedicated internal committee, made up of passionate employees focused on "saving the planet" has developed a comprehensive plan to help reduce our environmental impact.

One of the most pressing areas we have identified is our use of plastic water bottles. After evaluating our consumption, we found that we use approximately 42,000 plastic bottles each year, which is equivalent to around \$50,0000. While cost is not the primary driver of this initiative, it is eye opening to realize how much plastic waste we generate and how expensive bottled water can be.



Elimination of Plastic Bottles: Once our current supply of plastic water bottles is used up, we will no longer be using them at the club. Instead, we will provide water coolers in the back offices for staff use and remove bottled water from all back of the house areas.



Water Stations: We will offer cold water in pitchers during meetings and switch to glass or aluminum bottles in fitness areas, garage, restaurant, and bars.



Water Bars: Look for specialty water bars throughout The Club by this summer, featuring refreshing lemon, strawberry, and other fruit infused waters!

Once we have successfully tackled the plastic water bottle initiative, we will move forward with our additional targeted areas such as:



Composting: We will begin composting kitchen waste to minimize our environmental impact.



Waste Separation: We will implement better waste separation processes throughout The Club to ensure that materials are recycled or disposed of responsibly.



Green Building Certification: As a long-term goal, we are working towards earning our Green Building Certification, which will highlight our commitments to sustainability and corporate responsibility.

We are proud of the steps we are taking to make our Club more sustainable and to play a part in protecting the planet for future generations. Stay tuned for updates on our progress and how you can get involved.




## Reciprocal Club Spotlight
