
MESSAGE FROM THE

As November marks the close of our fiscal year, I am pleased to report significant progress in strengthening the Club's financial health. With transparency and candor, we addressed economic realities and, thanks to your tremendous support, have made meaningful strides in improving our working capital and overall financial condition. While our work continues, these achievements are vital steps toward preserving our exceptional Club for the future.



Our long-awaited Elevator Modernization Project will begin in January, starting with two of our six elevators. We expect full completion within eighteen months. In our commitment to stewardship, we revisited prior proposals, launched a new bidding process, and—with the help of dedicated Members—selected a vendor who meets our high standards for quality and safety. This effort also reduced cost estimates by over \$1 million. I deeply appreciate the diligent work of several Members and wish to express special thanks to Frank Gonzalez for generously contributing time and expertise as he leads this important project.

Next year's annual Capital Contribution amount will be determined and announced in early 2026 and is not expected to exceed the July 2025 amount. For 2026, rather than making this cash contribution, Members may fulfill their capital obligation by successfully proposing a new member in their respective category who is initiated before July 1, 2026. Please consider proposing outstanding candidates and contact our Director of Membership, Stephanie Shriver, for assistance.

Thank you for your support, questions, and input as we continue to build upon the Club's proud legacy. I look forward to hosting more coffee and wine discussions, where I hope to connect with many of you directly. Dates will be shared soon. In the meantime, I look forward to seeing you around the Club.




Dear Members,

The Member Survey

Over the past several months, we invited our Members to participate in the California Club Member Survey: Guiding the Future, Together. The purpose of this survey was to better understand what our Members value most about their Club experience and to identify opportunities where we can continue to grow, strengthen, and enhance the Club for generations to come.

We are very pleased to share that participation was strong and that the feedback was thoughtful, candid, and deeply appreciated. Members expressed tremendous pride in the Club's history, traditions, culture, and sense of community. Words such as "elegance," "prestige," "ambience," "tradition," "comfort," and "outstanding service" consistently emerged as top reasons why the Club holds such meaningful value in our Members' lives.

One of the most significant positive indicators from the survey is that the vast majority of our Members stated they would feel comfortable recommending the California Club to friends or family. In industry terms, this reflects a very high Net Promoter Score (NPS), which is the strongest metric of trust, satisfaction, loyalty, and long-term member commitment. In the private club world, NPS is considered one of the most critical performance measurements, and this overwhelmingly favorable result reinforces both the strength of our community and the pride our Members feel in one of the most iconic and respected clubs in the United States.

Alongside the positive sentiment, Members also shared thoughtful suggestions for improvement —and we are grateful for every one of them. A common theme members highlighted was the desire for enhanced and diversified dining experiences, expanded social and networking opportunities, and increased accessibility to Club services. Members also expressed support for cultural programs, special interest groups, and continued focus on younger-member engagement. Many Members asked insightful questions about the Strategic Plan and requested follow-up conversations, which we welcome.

I would like to thank you to all our Members for being here with us, building strong relationship as a family together and I will do my best to create desserts that will bring happiness and unforgettable memories to our Members.




Reciprocal Club Spotlight

Members and guests can enjoy daily changing menus and a


